Re: Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation (CORP) update

Dear Ms. Richson and Town Board Members,

In April 23, 2018, the Town Board discussed the planned update of the Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan (CORP). The Board discussed three different timetables for the development and completion of the plan. The Board thought the latest of the three, which would begin in September 2018 and finish in February, 2019 would be preferable.

As a reminder, the Town seeks to update its CORP every 5 years to help manage and prioritize the acquisitions and development of Town recreational facilities and to be eligible for Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources related park and recreational trail grant funding.

The Town Park Commission plans to kick-off the update to the CORP at their October 8, 2018 meeting. Prior to the meeting, the Park Commission would like to get input and direction from the Town Board.

Development of the CORP is part of a needs assessment exercise and is not necessarily meant to guide or set park impact fees as it has in the past. As much as possible, the park fee structure should be ignored at this stage. Park impact fee adjustments can be made based on the findings of the park needs assessment, but should not be the focus of the CORP update process. Rather, the Town should be assessing its needs, and taking inventory of current parks and trail facilities to determine what should be included in the CORP. In assessing Town needs, a review of the park survey completed in the spring of 2018 is one important piece of information to start with.

Please review the attached Town of Middleton Recreational Survey from the spring of 2018. The second attached document is a summary of the trails comments from the survey sorted by location in the Town. Upon review of these documents, and considering your knowledge and experience with the Town's Parks and Public Recreational Trails, it would be helpful for the Board to provide guidance to the Park Commission at the October 1, 2018 Board meeting. Guidance could include thoughts on the types and number of parks the Town should plan, the general location of planned parks, the types of trails that should be developed, and what Town priorities for parks and trails should be for the next 5 years. The Town Board is encouraged to participate throughout the CORP planning process.

The Park Commission will then take this guidance under advisement as they work through a park and trail needs assessment. After the needs assessment is complete, the Park Commission will refine goals for inclusion in the updated CORP.

The Town budgeted \$10,000 for updating the CORP. We estimate our fees to complete this scope to be \$8,500. After completion of the CORP, the Town should complete a Park Impact Fee assessment and

update the park fee and trails and park inventory. The Town budgeted \$4,000 for this simplified approach to update the park fee and \$1,500 for updating the trails and parks inventory. We estimate that we can complete the work within these budgeted amounts.

If the Town doesn't agree with the new park fee determined by the process, the CORP will have to be amended as necessary to match the adopted fee. Our fees to revise the CORP at this stage are not included in the above stated fees.

We look forward to discussing your input on the CORP at the October 2018 Town Board Meeting.





Q2 The Park Commission is considering additional parks for the area south of Mineral Point Road. Below are the park options being considered. Please select the option you prefer.



Q3 If the Town did create a larger community park, what type of sports activities do think would be important to have there?



Q4 How long have you lived in the Town of Middleton?







Q7 How important do you think it is for the Town to add an off-leash dog park?







Q18 Would you support using Town financial resources for any of following?






